The Department of CMLL at Mississippi State offers classes in Chinese, French, German, Ancient Greek, Italian, Japanese, Latin, Russian, and Spanish. The department goes beyond classroom education, offering students the opportunity to experience the world's cultures through language clubs, honor societies, and departmental events.

The department collaborates with the Shackouls Honors College to provide honors sections of our French, German, and Spanish courses; to host an annual Classical week; and to sponsor visiting lecturers.

One of CMLL's most exciting collaborations is with the International Business Program. IB is a highly competitive program that combines students' business interests with the culture and language needed to succeed in a business world that is steadily becoming more and more international. IB students receive two degrees, a B.B.A. or B.A.C.C. in the business area of their choice and a B.A. in Foreign Languages with a concentration in Spanish, French, German, or Asian Studies. All IB students are required to complete a business internship as well as a study abroad program. IB graduates are prepared to embark on an exciting business career that provides ample opportunity for travel and cultural discovery while simultaneously enjoying a 100% job placement rate!

CMLL majors prepare for careers in government (State Department, FBI, CIA, the military, immigration, etc.), International business, medicine, law, teaching (at all levels), and other language-related careers.

## CMLL MAJOR & MINOR DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

- **B.A. In Foreign Languages - 123 total hours with concentrations available in:**

- Asian Studies
- Classics
- French
- German
- Spanish

- **The Foreign Languages Minor:**

A minor in Foreign Languages with concentrations in Chinese, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Russian, and Spanish may be obtained upon satisfactory completion of 18 semester hours in one target language. A minor with concentration in Classics requires 15 hours, 12 of which must be Greek or Latin courses beyond the first year; the remaining course may be any FL Classics course.

- **World Language Teaching Minor:**

A minor in World Language Teaching introduces interested students to a potential career in education. Through 15 credit hours of coursework, students will have opportunities to design lesson plans, materials, and assessments that engage K-12 language learners. In addition, coursework will focus on applying theories in second language acquisition to real school practice situations.

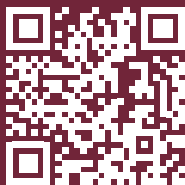
